What is worldview?

- There is a lot of competition for your heart and mind. Every idea has a source (it comes from somewhere) and a consequence (it takes you somewhere) (Deuteronomy 30:11–14; Psalm 1; Proverbs 29:1).
 - Right ideas have the right source and take you to God's blessing.
 - Wrong ideas have the wrong source and take you to punishment and hurt.
- In order to have an undistorted view of reality, you need to understand the assumptions and actions that shape the people in your culture (Psalm 119:97–104; Proverbs 16:25).
- Everyone needs a filter to help him/her navigate a world that is full of competing ideas. The filter you use is your worldview (Psalm 119:105–112).
- Everyone has a worldview, but not everyone has the same worldview (Matthew 20:20–28). What's yours?
- Your worldview is the intellectual, emotional, and spiritual filter through which you experience, understand, and respond to your circumstances.
- God has provided an undistorted worldview through His Word by communicating basic truths that are fundamental to every aspect of your life (2 Peter 1:3–5).

There is a battle between secular and biblical worldviews.

There are 3 basic building blocks of a biblical worldview.

- 1. Universe is a creation, not an accident (Genesis 1; John 1).
- 2. I am part of a larger purpose (Romans 8:28–30; Colossians 1:13–20).
- 3. I am an image-bearer of someone else, not an end unto myself (Ephesians 2:10; 4:24; Colossians 3:10).

Why is a biblical worldview important?

It answers the three most important life questions:

- 1. Is God real? What is He doing?
- 2. What is my purpose? Why do I exist?
- 3. Why is the world broken and how can it be fixed?

What difference does a biblical worldview make in the life of a Christian (Romans 12:1-2)?

- A biblical worldview sets me apart from the sinful culture of the world.
- 2. A biblical worldview aids in spiritual transformation.
- 3. A biblical worldview helps me know how to make decisions that please God.
